#### Weekly Gospel Broadcast.

The live weekly gospel preaching at all the three different FM radio stations (Fox FM @ Kumasi, Adwenpa Fm @ Tarkwa, and Nkwan Fm @ Assin Fosu) have as always been very successful this year with recorded baptisms. In all 12 baptisms have recorded from these live radio preachings and about 10 backsliders have been restored within the year. We are looking forward to your continuous financial support and prayers for this program in 2024.

#### Working with the campus church at University of Mines and Technology @ Tarkwa

I have assisted the campus church of Christ this year whenever the university is in session with assigned teachings and sermons. The Tarkwa church of Christ with some brethren who are alumni of the university are planning to construct an auditorium for the campus church so that brethren who are students at the university would have their own place of worship near the university. The Tarkwa church of Christ has given the campus church a piece of land to build the auditorium.

#### Preaching work/duties at Tarkwa Church of Christ, Western Ghana

One of the highlights of my preaching duties at Tarkwa church of Christ this year is the evangelism that was carried out in the month of September which I reported on in my October update. The evangelism was done in four communities around Tarkwa. Before the evangelism, training was given to members on how they could approach people with the gospel on one on one basis. 7 baptisms were recorded, and 256 prospects were reached during the program. I am happy to report that since then additional 6 baptisms have been recorded from the list of prospects that we continue to study with.
